

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# Chairperson's Address, 2020-2021

As the new school year, 2020-21, began, we dared to dream of 'normality' returning after the challenges of last year. Sadly, Covid-19 continued to affect all walks of life, including the closure of schools once again, with circuit-breakers and full lockdowns instated. However, as the virus evolved, so did Gaelscoil Neachtain. Staff became proficient in their ability to deliver remote learning. The children embraced their new classrooms at home, their conversations via Zoom, and provision for those in need developed as quickly as the outside world changed. #### Mission Statement of Gaelscoil Neachtain

Gaelscoil Neachtain is a co-educational, interdenominational, controlled, Irish-medium primary school. Here at Gaelscoil Neachtain, every child is encouraged, every day, to believe in his/her value as a person and, in turn, to value all others. Children, parents and staff, supported by the Board of Governors, work together to help each child achieve his/her potential as a confident bi-lingual in a safe and caring environment. We have high expectations for *all* our children. At Gaelscoil Neachtain, we appreciate the Irish language as a valuable, living heritage, and, embrace it to facilitate and enhance every child's learning potential. We foster, also, understanding and respect for all cultures and traditions and celebrate diversity. Gaelscoil Neachtain is a place of learning led by the Spirit, a place where the Christian ethos is fostered, a place where good character is nurtured.

#### Aims of Gaelscoil Neachtain

At Gaelscoil Neachtain, we recognise the spiritual, emotional, academic and physical needs of all children. We work together to create an atmosphere and ethos which contributes to their care, safety, well-being and learning. We recognise the place of parents as their children's first teachers and warmly welcome, and actively encourage, parents' participation in their children's learning. The staff work to provide successful learning and to tackle disadvantage so that every child can fulfil his / her potential. We are committed to ensuring continuous high standards through planning, practice, assessment and reflection. Gaelscoil Neachtain is committed to positively addressing all challenges, as they arise, with children's education and welfare being paramount in all decision making. By developing links with the local community, and beyond, Gaelscoil Neachtain aims to enrich the children's cultural and educational experience. Gaelscoil Neachtain aims to be a place of learning influenced by the Spirit, a place of kindness, a place where good character is fostered.

### **School Profile and Ethos**

Gaelscoil Neachtain is situated at 8, Chapel Road, Dungiven. The Gaelscoil opened in September 2012 with an enrolment of 63 pupils and was situated in mobile classrooms at 11a Curragh Road, Dungiven. In June, 2014, Gaelscoil Neachtain moved to the refurbished building of the former Dungiven Controlled Primary School, at 8 Chapel Road. An extension to the Gaelscoil was completed in February, 2019.

There are six permanent classrooms not including Naíscoil Neachtain. In addition, there is an ICT area, multi-purpose hall and servery.

The Gaelscoil is well resourced with a range of equipment including six interactive whiteboards, i-pads, indoor and outdoor play-based learning equipment and a plentiful supply of text books and reading books.

In June 2018, a Development Proposal for statutory nursery unit was agreed to provide 26 part-time nursery places with effect from 1 September 2018.

Gaelscoil Neachtain is a place of learning led by the Spirit, a place where the Christian ethos is fostered, a place where good character is nurtured. We welcome pupils from all faith and non-faith backgrounds. We serve the spiritual needs of each child according to the wishes of the parent.

Our *Cairde Gael* pupils work with Gaelscoil staff to support, encourage and promote the speaking of Irish throughout the Gaelscoil. Every *Cara Gael* has a badge in recognition of the honour and the responsibility it carries. All children are encouraged, and have opportunities for reward, to make every effort to speak Irish. Four 'houses' operate in the Gaelscoil, namely, Ulster, Munster, Leinster and Connacht, and every child is a member of one house. Unfortunately, due to social distancing implemented because of COVID-19, the house system was restricted to in-class activities during the school year 2020 – 2021. Children's efforts in speaking Irish were still recognized in various ways, however, including *Gaeilgeoir na Seachtaine* (Irish speaker of the Week).

Our *Comhairle Scoile* / School Council continued to give pupils a voice and involve them in the decision-making processes of the school.

Our Coiste Glas / Eco-Committee also gave pupils a voice and involved them in developing environmental awareness. Having achieved Eco-Schools Bronze flag in 2017, and the Silver flag in 2018, our World Around Us Co-ordinator continues to lead a programme of activities working towards the Green Flag award.

During the school year 2020 – 2021, COVID-19 restrictions limited certain social activities including full interaction between classes, e.g. *Cairde Gael* and *Coiste Glas* activities. We look forward to the easing of all restrictions in the next school year and gradual integration of social activities to complement children's positive learning experience.

We are committed to the development of a strong partnership between children, parents and our community.

#### **Child Protection**

We have a primary responsibility for the care, welfare and safety of the children in our charge and we carry out this responsibility through the Pastoral Care Policy and Child Protection Policy which aims to provide a caring, supportive and safe environment to enable each child to reach his/her full potential. All staff who work in Gaelscoil Neachtain, both teaching and non-teaching, have been vetted through Access N.I. Structures and procedures are in place to protect our children by ensuring that everyone who works in the school, i.e. teachers, non-teaching staff and volunteers, have clear guidance on the action which is required where abuse or neglect of a child is suspected.

### Communication

Despite the challenges of lockdown and the COVID-19 pandemic, Gaelscoil Neachtain continued its communications frequently with children and parents throughout. During the school year, 2020 - 2021, the Gaelscoil Neachtain App was the main means of general communication whilst e-mail was used by class teachers to communicate personally with parents. Communication by phone was used as appropriate.

#### **School Attendance**

Pupil attendance for the school year 2020 – 2021 was 97.2%.

#### COVID-19

In response to the rampant spread of COVID-19, the NI Executive announced that all schools should close for face-to-face teaching from Monday, 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2020. Learning and teaching subsequently moved on-line.

Staff returned to the Gaelscoil on 18th August in preparation for the new school year, 2020 -2021. Workshops were held to educate staff about the new systems in place to mitigate transmission of the COVID-19 virus. Notices, and clear directions, informing all of safety measures, were put in place inside and outside the Gaelscoil building.

Staff agreed the format of a 'new school day' and parents were informed accordingly. Children returned on Monday, 24th August. Great emphasis was placed on safety and pastoral care.

During the school year 2020 - 2021, however, COVID-19 challenged all of us as positive cases were reported again and again. PHA and DENI guidance were followed in all situations and children's learning moved on-line, as necessary, when staff and children were isolating. Staff and children's ICT skills developed very quickly in this climate.

A second lockdown was announced in January, 2021, and remote learning, Monday – Friday, began immediately. This involved a variety of synchronous and asynchronous learning, videos and writing. Parents were asked to collect reading books for children on Mondays and return on Fridays.

As happened during the first lockdown, much emphasis was placed on pastoral care and similar strategies were put in place.

Gaelscoil Neachtain was open for supervised learning for children of key workers during this period - forty-two children registered. On average, thirty children attended every day within four *bubbles*.

On Monday,  $8^{th}$  March, 2021, we welcomed children in Naíscoil and in Ranganna 1 – 3 back for face-to-face teaching. On Monday,  $22^{nd}$  March, we welcomed children in Ranganna 4 – 7 back for face-to-face teaching.

In February, 2021, parents were given an opportunity to review their, and their children's experience, of remote learning through an on-line questionnaire. 67% - over two-thirds – of parents responded and, overall, feedback was very positive. An overview of children's and parents' experience was provided as well as important information regarding teaching and learning. Particular aspects of information were acted on, as appropriate, and parents were provided with full feedback relating to the questionnaire.

COVID-19 foregrounded the issue of mental health which concerns everyone - children, parents and staff. Gaelscoil Neachtain takes this issue very seriously and, during the school year 2020 – 2021, we developed a professional and personal focus. Using funding provided by the Department of Education, the Gaelscoil invested in workshops, training and resources. Particular strategies, activities and resources have been introduced to teaching and learning. Professional advice is sought as appropriate and mental health for all is under constant review. The importance of talking to someone is reinforced with all. The focus on good mental health for all will continue.

## **Monitoring and Evaluating Procedures**

The following Monitoring and Evaluating Procedures remained in place during the school year, 2020 - 2021 –

- Weekly / half-term review of pupil targets
- Co-ordinators monitor weekly / half-term plans against the agreed success criteria and provide feedback to teachers.
- Teacher observations to ensure classroom practice reflect short, mid and long-term planning.
- Classroom observation feedback.
- Book trawl
- Monitoring of Friday Review, end of half-term assessment, end of year assessment.
- Teacher feedback.

# **Pupil Progress and Standards of Attainment**

Baseline Assessment in Literacy and Maths was carried out in Ranganna 3-7 at the beginning of September, 2020.

Outside of lockdown, half-term assessment in Literacy and Maths was carried out throughout the school year.

Gaelscoil Neachtain's end of year, standardised assessment took place in May 2021. As happened in the school year 2020 – 2021, and due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, and associated lockdown, the Council for Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment (CCEA) informed all primary schools that End of Key Stage data was not required for the academic year 2020 – 2021.

Gaelscoil Neachtain continues to closely monitor and track the progress of all our pupils and meet regularly to discuss children's progress across the Gaelscoil. All assessment results are analysed and inform future planning.

Annual written reports were sent to parents on Friday, 25<sup>th</sup> June, 2021.

# Additional Support to Enhance Curricular Provision / Extra Curricular Activities

As has been the situation in all schools due to COVID-19 restrictions, activities to enhance the curriculum, including extra-curricular activities, were curtailed throughout the school year 2020-2021. Children, however, benefitted from the following activities -
